Is my child too ill for school?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school when they're unwell. There are government guidelines for schools about managing specific infectious diseases at GOV.UK. These say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't. If you do keep your child at home, it's important to phone the school. Let them know that your child won't be in and give them the reason. If your child is well enough to go to school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, let the main office know.

What to do about other conditions?

High temperature - If your child has a high temperature, keep them off school until it goes away.

Feeling anxious or worried - It's normal for children to feel a little anxious sometimes. They may get a tummy ache or headache or have problems eating or sleeping. Avoiding school can make a child's anxiety about going to school worse. It's good to talk about any worries they have with your child's teacher to work with the school to find ways to help them. If your child is still struggling and it's affecting their everyday life, it might be good to talk to your GP.

Coughs, colds and COVID-19 - It's fine to send your child to school with a minor cough or common cold. But if they have a fever, keep them off school until the fever goes. Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues and to wash their hands regularly.

Chickenpox - If your child has chickenpox, keep them off school until all the spots have crusted over. This is usually about 5 days after the spots first appeared.

Cold sores - There's no need to keep your child off school if they have a cold sore. Encourage them not to touch the blister or kiss anyone while they have the cold sore, or to share things like cups and towels.

Conjunctivitis - You don't need to keep your child away from school if they have conjunctivitis. Do get advice from your pharmacist. Encourage your child not to rub their eyes and to wash their hands regularly. they're feeling better, or their high temperature goes away.

Hand, foot and mouth disease - If your child has hand, foot and mouth disease but seems well enough to go to school, there's no need to keep them off. Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues straight away and to wash their hands regularly.

Head lice and nits - There's no need to keep your child off school if they have head lice. You can treat head lice and nits without seeing a GP.

Impetigo - If your child has impetigo, they'll need treatment from a pharmacist or GP, often with antibiotics. Keep them off school until all the sores have crusted over and healed, or for 48 hours after they start antibiotic treatment. Encourage your child to wash their hands regularly and not to share things like towels and cups with others.

Measles - If your child has measles, they'll need to see a GP. Call the GP surgery before you go in, as measles can spread to others easily. Keep your child off school for at least 4 days from when the rash first appears. They should also avoid close contact with babies and anyone who is pregnant or has a weakened immune system.

Ringworm - If your child has ringworm, see your pharmacist unless it's on their scalp, in which case you should see a GP. It's fine for your child to go to school once they have started treatment.

Scarlet fever - If your child has scarlet fever, they'll need treatment with antibiotics from a GP. Otherwise they'll be infectious for 2 to 3 weeks. Your child can go back to school 24 hours after starting antibiotics.

Slapped cheek syndrome (fifth disease) - You don't need to keep your child off school if they have slapped cheek syndrome because, once the rash appears, they're no longer infectious. Let the school or teacher know if you think your child has slapped cheek syndrome.

Sore throat - You can still send your child to school if they have a sore throat. But if they also have a high temperature, they should stay at home until it goes away. A sore throat and a high temperature can be symptoms of tonsillitis.

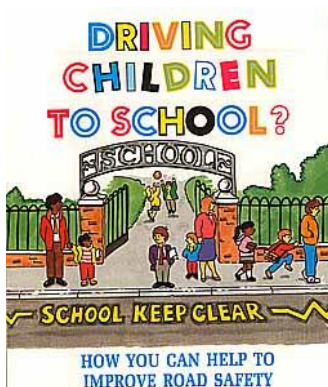
Threadworms - You don't need to keep your child off school if they have threadworms. Speak to your pharmacist, who can recommend a treatment.

Vomiting and diarrhoea - Children with diarrhoea or vomiting should stay away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days (48 hours).

WHEN IS SICK TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL? Tips for parents & caregivers



Road Safety & Parking



Last academic year we received several complaints from parents and residents regarding parking and road safety at drop off and pick up times. Dangerous parking is an increasing issue around schools, putting the safety of children and others at risk. Parking on zig-zag lines or pedestrian crossings can cause visibility issues to drivers and people walking the pavements alike.

Drivers should not park near a school entrance

This also includes anywhere that prevents access for emergency services, at or near a bus stop, opposite or within 10 metres of a junction, over a dropped kerb, and in front of an entrance to a property.

Drivers should not park on yellow zig-zag lines

These lines indicate the length of the road where stopping or waiting is strictly prohibited. Where there is an upright sign, there is a mandatory prohibition of stopping and/or waiting during the times shown. Yellow zig zag lines without signs do not have a Traffic Regulation Order and therefore, are not legally enforceable.

Drivers should not park on white zig-zag lines

Unlike yellow zig-zag lines, white zig-zag lines are enforced by local authorities and the police, and prohibit stopping or waiting even in the presence of a sign.

Drivers should not park on double yellow lines

Stopping or waiting on a double yellow line is strictly prohibited. Double yellow lines prevent vehicle owners from parking or waiting in this area at any time.

Drivers should not park on single yellow lines at certain times

Single yellow lines prohibit parking during specific times. A nearby sign will indicate the times in which vehicle owners are allowed to park on single yellow lines.

Drivers should not park on private forecourts

We have received complaints from the Post Office staff at the parade of shops opposite school that parents are using their forecourt as a car park and blocking staff access/ exits.

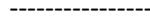

Jewellery & School attire

Please can we remind parents and carers of our school uniform policy.

Uniform and shoes

Full uniform must be adhered to. Trainers should not be worn with normal school uniform. These are only for PE days when children come to school in their PE kits. Ties must be worn with shirts (no polo shirts).



Jewellery

We ask children not to wear jewellery. Small gold colour stud earrings only are permitted and will need to be removed on PE days, or carefully covered with a sticking plaster (supplied by yourselves) to minimize dangers in PE or games.

Hair

Children's hair should be neat in appearance and tidy. We ask that children's hair is an appropriate style for school and must not reflect any extreme fashion and should not be dyed. Long hair should be tied back. We request that elaborate hair ties or hair bands are not used.

Nail Varnish & Make-up

We ask children not to wear nail varnish and/or any make-up to school.

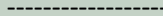
WHAT IS AN EMHP?
