Whilst learning about the Titanic we also investigated the roles of the Lookouts and why they were thought to be partially responsible.

For up-to-date information on daily venue activities, please check in with us. Below is an example of our scheduled holiday club activities.

Morning Schedule

- 08:00 - 08:45:** Early sign-ins arrive! Our leaders will have activities set up ready to start the day before the majority of children arrive on camp.
- 08:45 - 09:15:** Arrival Time: Sign-ins and warm-up with free play. Children can enjoy a variety of activities, including toys, sports equipment, and creative crafts to start the day.
- 09:15 - 09:30:** Group Circle Time: All children will gather round for circle time as we introduce the exciting activities planned for the day ahead.
- 09:30 - 11:00:** Sports Carousel & Creative Workshop: There will be a carousel of sports activities, allowing your child to freely explore a variety of games. Indoors, they'll dive into painting, drawing, and hands-on crafting projects. While outside children can enjoy our forest school areas, play on the trial equipment, build bug hotels & collect resources from nature to use in arts and crafts sessions
- 11:00 - 11:15:** Snack Break: Refuel with snacks to keep energy levels high for the next batch of activities.
- 11:15 - 12:15:** Team Games & Crafts: Your child will participate in age-group matches such as football, dodgeball, and cricket, with alternative sports activities like gymnastics and dance also available. Meanwhile, there will be indoor biscuit decorating and themed crafting station, like making Valentines day cards, heart bunting and friendship bracelets.

Lunchtime & Afternoon

- 12:15 - 12:45:** Lunch Break: Those who have paid for hot lunches will enjoy a warm meal with their friends. Lunches are made either on site by a chef or local cafe.
- 12:45 - 13:15:** Outdoor Play-time: We will continue the fun with outdoor play in the playground and outside gyms.
- 13:15 - 14:45:** Sports Tournament & Skill Game: Your child will spend the afternoon engaging in Nerf battles, gymnastics, or showcasing their talents in a fun and interactive group talent show. We'll then head into a forest exploration adventure!

End Of Day & Late Afternoon

- 15:00:** End-of-Day Wrap-Up: All children will gather together for our closing ceremony where children will receive certificates and enjoy music, ending the day on a high note as parents arrive for collection.
