Road Safety



The Road Safety Team from BCP visiting the school week commencing 8th June to visit each year group and talk about the this.

As a school of over 600 pupils, including our youngest learners who are only 4 years old, the safety of our children must be our absolute priority.

Bearing this in mind and following up on some road safety concerns, we wish to clarify the expected conduct for all drivers using the area around Hill View Primary.

1. Strict "No Stopping" Policy

There should be no stopping or "drive-by" drop-offs at any point along the road outside the school, unless you have a blue badge and are using the disabled parking bays.

Stopping to let children jump out of cars creates significant tailbacks.

It forces other drivers into dangerous manoeuvres.

It blocks access for our neighbours and emergency vehicles.

2. Speed Limit and Awareness

Please observe a maximum speed of 20mph.

Given the high volume of children and families crossing, we urge you to drive significantly slower during peak drop-off and pick-up times.

3. Community Etiquette

We ask that all parents follow the Highway Code and show respect to our local residents.

We want to maintain a positive relationship with our community, and your cooperation is vital in achieving this. Our staff are not legally permitted or trained to manage traffic on public highways. Therefore, we rely entirely on your personal responsibility and adherence to road safety laws to keep our students safe.

Thank you for your cooperation in making the journey to school safer for every child at Hill View Primary Academy.

For up-to-date information on daily venue activities, please check in with us. Below is an example of our scheduled holiday club activities.

Morning Schedule

08:00 - 08:45: Early sign-ins arrive! Our leaders will have activities set up ready to start the day before the majority of children arrive on camp.

08:45 - 09:30: The main arrival time. Sign-ins and warm-up with free play. Children can enjoy a variety of activities, including logs, sports equipment, and creative crafts to start the day.

09:30 - 09:45: Group circle time. All children will gather round for circle time as we introduce the exciting activities planned for the day ahead.

09:45 - 11:00: Sports carouse outside and a creative workshop inside. There will be a carouse of sports activities, allowing your child to freely explore a variety of games. Indoors, they'll dive into painting, drawing, and hands-on craft projects. While outside, children can enjoy our forest school of play on the trial equipment, build bug hotels & collect resources from nature to use in arts and crafts sessions.

11:00 - 11:30: Snack break! Refresh with snacks to keep energy levels high for the next batch of activities.

11:30 - 12:30: Year child will have the choice to participate in sport/ play matches such as football, basketball and cricket, with alternative sports activities like gymnastics and dance also available. Alternatively, there will be indoor basketball, decorating and themed crafting stations, like making summer lanterns, doing chains and friendship bracelets.

Lunchtime & Afternoon

12:35 - 12:45: Lunchtime! These who have paid for hot lunches will enjoy a warm meal with their friends. Lunches are made either on site by a chef or local restaurant.

12:45 - 1:15: We will continue the fun with outdoor play in the playground and outside gym.

1:15 - 14:45: Your child will spend the afternoon choosing to join in with craft activities, gymnastics or showcasing their talents in a fun and interactive group talent show. We'll then head into a forest exploration adventure and finish off the week on Friday with a WAT (Water Tact)!

End Of Day & Late Afternoon

15:00: All children will gather together for our closing ceremony where children will receive certificates and enjoy music, ending the day on a high note as parents arrive for collection.

15:00 - 17:30: Those who are booked into late collection will have a variety of evening child-led activities to help them wind down before collection. Snacks are provided for those staying late.
