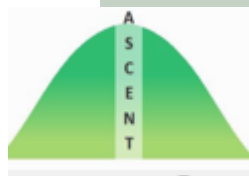

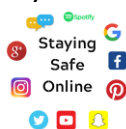

For up-to-date information on daily venue activities, please check in with us. Below is an example of our scheduled holiday club activities and our confirmed weekly themes.

Morning Schedule

- 08:00 - 08:30:** Early sign-ins arrive! Our leaders will have activities set up ready to start the day before the majority of children arrive on camp.
- 08:45 - 09:15:** The main arrival time. Sign-ins and warm-up with free play.
- 09:15 - 09:30:** Group circle time. All children will gather round for circle time as we introduce the exciting activities planned for the day ahead.
- 09:30 - 11:00:** Sports carousel outside and a creative workshop inside.
- 11:00 - 11:15:** Snack Break! Refresh with snacks to keep energy levels high for the next batch of activities.
